

Context Information - Academy

Hull Trinity House Academy is a thriving 11-16 secondary school of over 600 students. Founded in 1787 it is closely situated to its original site, in the heart of the City of Hull and still participates actively in the civic life of the city. The academy has a well-established reputation for excellence in education and our students are consistently among the highest achieving in the Humber Region. Hull Trinity House School was awarded Specialist Status in Engineering in 2008 and became an academy in April 2012. In September 2013 the academy moved to a larger site and more than doubled the student intake from 56 students to 120. The new building provides a truly modern setting with state-of-the-art facilities and technology to support our students in maximising their potential.

At Hull Trinity House Academy we are committed to ensuring that every individual matters and that every student and adult is valued. We encourage an ethos of community and fraternity where people are supportive of each other. Our staff team is made up of talented, committed and caring professionals who are well qualified to make sure that Hull Trinity House's curriculum, along with its guidance, care and support, meets the different needs of every young person, providing an environment in which they can thrive and flourish.

As an educational institution with over 230 years of history, Hull Trinity House Academy remains very proud of its history and traditions and our motto 'Spes Super Sydera' (Hope Beyond the Stars) still neatly sums up our academy's aims of continually raising aspirations, widening horizons and empowering our students to achieve their potential. Similarly, our mission statement 'Striving together to achieve excellence in everything we do' also illustrates the academy's clear determination to work with the students, parents, carers, and anyone else that can help to provide every student enrolled at our academy with the best possible education.

The academy constantly aims to keep pace with educational change and best practice in terms of pedagogy and pastoral care but, equally, it seeks to maintain its historical links with the Maritime Sector and an enduring ethos that has benefited so many young men throughout its illustrious past. Pupil population - Hull Trinity House Academy is a smaller than average secondary school for boys. It is oversubscribed and draws students from Kingston Upon Hull and the surrounding area. The proportion of students known to be eligible for free school meals is above average. As of October 2018, there were 630 students on roll
