

Delta Academies Trust has the mission statement “Changing Lives”, with the overarching aim being to improve educational outcomes for children in the north of England whilst creating a sustainable organisation that improves our society and the wider environment.

Hull Trinity House Academy is a non-catchment school and serves a very wide area. Our students are drawn from the entire City of Hull and beyond with 75% of our students living in Hull and 25% from outside of the City. As such we do not have any main feeder primaries with students instead coming from around 80 different primary schools. The admissions procedures are designed to ensure equality of access for all regardless of ability or place of residence.

We are a medium sized academy with a pan of 120 students per year, we are heavily over subscribed with approximately 300 applicants each year.

The City of Kingston Upon Hull is one of the most deprived cities in the country with the 4th highest overall deprivation score. Consequently the academy serves a largely deprived community with 33.6% our students identifying as pupil premium and 33.4% (national average 20.8%) eligible for free school meals. We are determined to ensure this does not result in low aspirations amongst our students and place a strong focus on education as a gateway to success. When asked why students applied to the Academy the answers are, more often than not, linked to the reputation of the academy and the student's desire for success as well as an interest in maritime careers.

The academy serves an increasing diverse community with 29.9% of our students identifying as minority ethnic and 22.6% of our total cohort being designated to be EAL. We have a small cohort of students who qualify for an EHCP (2.7%) and have a further 6.3% of students who are SEN support.

We work closely in conjunction with local partners and engage our public to ensure we meet the needs of our learners. It is imperative to us that we provide ‘life ready’ students and aim to provide experiences which enhance students’ experiences. We have the highest standards and expectations for all pupils and we strive to provide a curriculum that respects the needs of all pupils as well as one that encourages young people to seek continuous development and improvement.

We are proud to continue to serve the community of Hull and beyond providing equal access to opportunity for young people as we have done since 1787.
